Houston Methodist awards \$4.6 million to 59 Houston nonprofits

Houston Methodist gifted more than \$4.6 million to 59 local nonprofits, as part of the second installment of its Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Grant Program.

This funding is a part of the Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Grant Program the health care system created in 2020. Grants from the \$25 million fund will be awarded over five years to address the social determinants of health that lead to health inequities within racial, ethnic, and social minorities. The <u>first installment of \$2.5</u> <u>million was given in May 2021</u> to 37 nonprofits. This year, the organization increased its fund by 87%, according to Houston Methodist's announcement.

The grant program includes both DEI grants and social equity grants. The program will support 29 healthy neighborhood programs, 16 economic empowerment programs, and 17 educational empowerment programs at the nonprofits. The nonprofits received various amounts of funds, depending on their needs and requests, said <u>Ryane Jackson</u>, vice-president of community benefits at Houston Methodist. The dollar amount given to the organizations ranged from just under \$10,000 to \$375,000.

"It's incredibly encouraging to see so many local non-profit organizations working to close the health and social disparity gaps that exist among minority groups in the Houston area," Jackson said.

Jackson added that the DEI Grant Program received an increase in applicants, which then prompted Houston Methodist to increase the funds given out this year.

"It demonstrates the great need, but also demonstrates the passion of our community and I'm proud that Houston Methodist is raising awareness within the community that we are a partner for them not only from a health care access perspective but also working to address the root cause issues of health inequities," Jackson said. While Houston Methodist has worked with <u>nonprofits like Legacy in the past to increase health care access</u>, the nonprofits that were awarded this round of funds do not have a direct health care link. Jackson said the DEI Grant Program focuses on the root causes of access, which can be linked to race, gender, ZIP code, income, immigration status, and quality of life, and trying to uplift Houston communities through other ways. The next round of applications will begin this fall. Houston Methodist will call for letters of intent in October 2022 and that will be the start of a multistep process, Jackson said.
